### Main activities

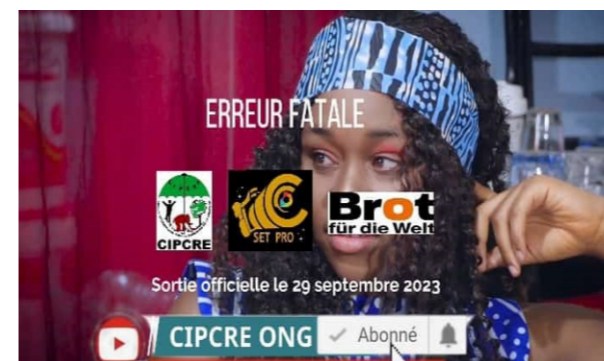
- Conduct advocacy with key stakeholders for development of the agro-ecological value chain and biological.
  - Promote agro-pastoral, eco-entrepreneurship for the benefit of young people and women in support of the development of the agro-ecological and organic value chain
  - Strengthen community resilience mechanisms to the effects of Climate Change
  - Strengthen the adoption of good hygiene and sanitation practices within educational establishments
  - Ensure the coordination of the Knowledge Center in Agro-ecology and Organic Agriculture in Central Africa
  - Collect and process Knowledge in agro-ecology and organic agriculture
  - Create and/or reformat knowledge products in agro-ecology and organic agriculture
  - Disseminate knowledge products to stakeholders to support the promotion of agro-ecology and organic agriculture
  - Facilitate the networking of actors for the promotion of agro-ecological and organic value chain and facilitate access to markets
  - Advocacy towards state actors and the private sector for the promotion of agro-ecology and organic agriculture
  - Support the development of active female leadership for the promotion of consumption of agro-ecological products and organic products within Households

## Peace and Social Cohesion

### Main activities

- Promote non-violence and the fight against drug trafficking and consumption in schools
- Promote social cohesion within communities through the peaceful management of land and agro-pastoral conflicts
- Strengthen living together within communities through the education of young people on political-ethnic tolerance and the promotion of cultural and ethnic diversity.
- Strengthen the protective environment for children who are victims of crises and of social inequality (REPEVICIS)
- Support the animation of the grievance redress mechanism, prevention and management of gender-based violence cases, linked to road works on the Babadjou-Bamenda axis
- Support the management unit of the Cameroon and Chad electricity grid interconnection project (PIRECT) in raising awareness and implementing the grievance redress mechanism, including gender-based violence, in Center region
- Promoting peace through theater and digital cinema
- Promote positive parenting in favor of peace through Peace Training Groups.
- Advocacy for the development of civic awareness in diversity based on common history and values/symbols of national unity
